## RECRUITING PARTICIPANTS IN HUMAN SUBJECT RESEARCH

## POLICY

Recruiting is part of the informed consent process in human subject research (HSR). Therefore, the University of Cincinnati (UC) Institutional Review Board (IRB) must protect potential HSR participants from coercion or undue influence during the recruitment process.

## METHODS AND MATERIALS USED IN RECRUITING

Methods of recruiting and materials used in the recruitment process must minimize the possibility of coercing or unduly influencing an individual to participate. The investigator and other study personnel who recruit potential participants must follow the recruiting methods approved by the IRB as part of the protocol. Advertisements, posters, flyers, scripts and other recruitment materials must be approved by the IRB before they may be used with potential participants.
